Who Should Participate?

A representative team of middle or high school youth and adults interested in deepening their understanding of restorative practices, building community and belonging, and using data to drive change. Teams typically consist of 2-4 adults and 10-15 youth partners.

What is the Opportunity?

- Work with UP staff to design a plan to meet your school where it is on its restorative practices implementation journey.
- Youth-Adult Team Retreats facilitated in partnership between UP staff and team

members (typically 4-5 retreats total, in person)

- UP's ongoing coaching and support, virtual or in person
- Opportunities for professional development: staff training, virtual learning opportunities, and a three-credit graduate course for adults available from Southern New Hampshire University (or receive professional development hours toward recertification)
