What does this look like?

UP's programs are customized to meet the needs of teams. Our past work supporting successful school transitions has included:

- 2-3 half-day retreats for school teams, bringing together youth and adults, focusing on what excites and what concerns students about the school transition.
- Fostering connections between younger and older students from different schools to help build relationships and address questions about the shift to a new school.
- An evening parent/caregiver dialogue night, supporting students in engaging with the important adults in their life around the joys and concerns that come with this change.

- Support collecting and analyzing data from students and their parents/caregivers, with the goal of fostering more meaningful conversations about the move.
- Virtual coaching sessions to support the work throughout the process.

Who Should Participate?

A representative team of upper elementary or middle school youth who will be moving up to a new school next year, as well as adults interested in exploring that process in partnership with them. Teams typically consist of 2-4 adults and 10-15 youth partners.
