When implemented holistically with youth and adults sitting in authentic partnership, restorative practices help shift paradigms and develop a culture where everyone's voice is heard and valued. Relationships become the cornerstone of the community, with an emphasis on collaborative problem solving and collective responsibility.

What is the Opportunity?

- Work with UP staff to design a plan to meet your school where it is on its restorative practices implementation journey. In addition to school-based work, we are also able to support districts in training and mobilizing teams from each of its schools.
- Youth-Adult Team Retreats facilitated in partnership between UP staff and team members (typically 4-5 retreats total, in person)
- UP's ongoing coaching and support, virtual or in person
- Other add-on opportunities: staff and faculty training, virtual learning opportunities, and professional development hours toward recertification

Who Should Participate?

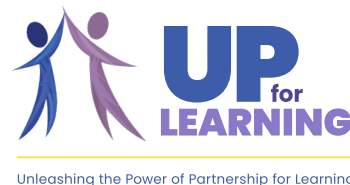
